position of NDA towards dental chains problems with dental chains possible solutions

All countries to secure a uniform application of professional law by introducing compulsory membership in dental chambers for all kind of legal entities offering dental services in the interest of patients. It would be contradictory and harmful, if legal entities practicing dentistry, unlike self-employed and employed dentists, are not subject to professional regulations which serve in particular to protect patients. The compulsory membership only of the individual dentist, working in a legal entity would be by far not sufficient. There is a risk that employed dentists are entering into conflict with their employer and face pressure, if they claim to comply with the requirements of professional law. In addition, a



frequent change of personnel in the dental chains can be observed, which makes constant monitoring from a professional law perspective difficult. Where no dental chambers exist, an equivalent level of control of professional law must be ensured either by the national authorities or by dental associations, which are representative for the profession
